

Reviewing Four Pillars and Three Axis

I. Four Pillars

A. *The purpose of church*

“19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.”
(Matthew 28:19-20)

B. *The method of disciple making*

“14 He appointed twelve designating them apostles that they might be with him and that he might send them out to preach 15 and to have authority to drive out demons.”
(Mark 3:14-15)

“1 Follow my example, as I follow the example of Christ.” (1 Cor. 11:1)

C. *The division of church ministries*

“11 And He gave some as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers, 12 for the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ” (Ephesians 4:11-12)

D. *The servant leadership*

“42 Jesus called them together and said, ‘You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. 43 Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, 44 and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. 45 For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.’” (Mark 10: 42-45)
